Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce



Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce is a Jamaican sprinter. She became famous in 2008 for becoming the first Caribbean woman to win an Olympic gold medal in the 100 metres.

Edward Teach



Edward Teach was a pirate who lived from 1680-1718, he was also known as Blackbeard. He attacked ships in the Caribbean.

Siddhartha Gautama is also known as the Buddha. He was the founder of the religion known as Buddhism.

What are Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce's achievements?

At the 2008 Beijing Olympics, Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce became the first Caribbean woman to win gold in the 100 m.

In 2020 she won a silver medal at the Tokyo Olympics, becoming the first athlete to win a medal in the 100m at four consecutive Olympic games.

Shelly-Ann Fraser Pryce is one of the most decorated athletes in history, winning ten gold and four silver medals. She is the only person to win five world titles in the 100 m—in 2009, 2013, 2015, 2019, and 2022.
