

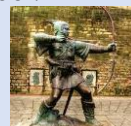

**Robin Hood**

**What does an animal need to survive?**

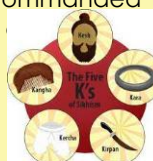
Animals need food, shelter from weather and predators, water, air and a place to raise young.
