Florence Nightingale

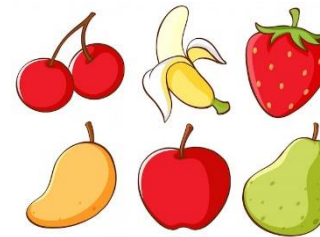
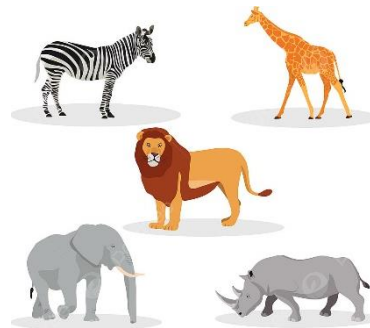
Florence Nightingale was an English nurse reformer. Her nickname was the Lady with the lamp.

stem	The main body or stalk of a plant.
Victorian era	A period of time in Britain between 1837 and 1901.
